

BOARDING AGREEMENT

Vaccines and Internal Parasite Tests:

In order to board your pet(s), his/her rabies vaccination status and certificate must be up to date and valid. All other vaccinations must have been administered within the last 12 months. If your pet(s) did not receive vaccines at this facility, you must show documentation from a veterinarian that verifies current vaccinations and intestinal parasite tests. Any vaccines and/or de-wormers administered at this facility during boarding will be added to your bill.

External Parasites:

All animals will be inspected for the presence of any external parasites (fleas, ticks, ear mites, lice, etc.) upon boarding. **ALL ANIMALS ENTERING EASTSIDE ANIMAL HOSPITAL TO BOARD WILL BE TREATED WITH CAPSTAR (A FLEA PREVENTATIVE THAT KILLS ALL LIVE FLEAS WITHIN 24 HOURS).**

Diet:

A premium prescription diet that is easily digested is the food provided for your pet(s) during his/her stay. Since stress in a kennel situation is unavoidable, we recommend our prescription diet. If you prefer to bring food from home, we will be pleased to feed it to your pet(s). Please indicate the food to be fed, how much, and how often.

Medication:

We will administer any medications to your pet(s) for an additional fee. Consult our staff for current pricing. Please bring the medication in the labeled container it was prescribed in with detailed instructions. If medications need to be filled or refilled, they will be added to your bill.

Statement of Kennel Policy:

1. A day's board is charged for every night your pet is with us.
2. Pets can be picked up between 7:00 AM and 7:00 PM Monday thru Friday; 8:00 AM and 1:00 PM Saturday.
3. Personal items may be left; however, we are **NOT** responsible for lost or damaged items. In order to keep items together, we will **NOT** wash soiled laundry.
4. Eastside Animal Hospital strives to provide a comfortable stress free boarding environment. However, we are not responsible for conditions that often are unavoidable in boarding environments such as, but not limited to, weight loss, hair loss, rough hair coat, kennel cough, upper respiratory infection, diarrhea, fleas.
